Summary

- 1. The first "A" in the word "HANDBALLS" stands for "Acadians Scattered".
- 2. During the many years of wars between Britain and France, the control of the Acadian land changed hands many times.
- 3. The French gave up Acadia to the British in the "Treaty of Utrecht" in 1713.
- 4. Most of Acadia (Nova Scotia) was under British control. The French Acadians wanted to remain neutral, and therefore would not sign an oath of allegiance to fight for Britain if a war broke out with France. They were seen as a threat because of this.
- 5. In 1755, the British began to expel the Acadians from their land. They were taken to the Thirteen Colonies, Louisiana, France, and Cape Breton Island.
- 6. A great number of their homes were destroyed by fire, and their property and land confiscated.
- 7. Approximately 11,000 people were deported, and one third of those died.
